Uffculme School students and staff are celebrating a truly exceptional set of GCSE results as a remarkable 86% of the year group achieved the gold standard of 5 or more A*-C results including English and Maths in this year's public examinations. These outstanding results are an improvement of 3% from last year and this is the fifth successive year of increased results. They represent the culmination of five years of hard work and reflect students' outstanding commitment to their studies alongside the very positive relationships which they have built up with their teachers

Headteacher Lorraine Heath said "We are all absolutely delighted that these young people have done so well. Once again students have smashed their targets and produced the best results in the history of the school. They prove that the combination of a strong, supportive culture, hard work, valuing success, determination and excellent teaching really does make a difference.
